Public Involvement

Meet Your Neighbour

Four faith events across the Borough under the theme of 'Meet Your Neighbour' have been held.

Meet Your Neighbour – St Jude's Church

At the first of our Meet Your Neighbour events, the Rev Carl Schaeffer discussed Christianity at St. Jude's Anglican Church. The event was well received, with over 70 delegates present, from many faiths. "It has been a very positive experience to share time together and reach a broader understanding of various faiths"



Meet Your Neighbour – Darwen Central United Reformed Church

The 2nd Event was held at Central URC in Darwen. The Rev Sarah Moore opened discussion about refugees and asylum seeking and faiths in the town. The event featured refugees and asylum seekers' personal stories and highlighted the work of the church historically in providing help for them. "Opened my eyes to the bravery of people to take the first step on a difficult journey to 'freedom'"



Meet Your Neighbour - Leamington Road Baptist Church

The 3rd Faith Event focussed on Hinduism and was presented by Blackburn Hindu Centre. 74 people attended this event, featuring traditional food and dancing. "I was a member of this congregation some 20 years ago... when it was extremely conservative and narrow in its thinking ... to have hosted an evening/event such as this then would have been inconceivable ... My ...HOW THINGS HAVE CHANGED!!"

Remembering

A key element of the Interfaith Council's work relates to our civic duty as faith communities to remember those who have fought and died in wars and conflicts. As part of this, the IFC participated in Remembrance Sunday commemorations.

Next Steps for 2007/08

Highlighted below are some of the initiatives and projects that are going to be part of the coming year's programme:

- Remembrance Sunday & Holocaust Memorial Day
- Arrange future Faith Events
- An anti-secularisation/pro-religious publicity campaign
- Young People's Interfaith Forum
- Youth conference on creating a society based on respect rather than tolerance
- Interfaith football competition and athletic events for younger people
- Arranging a Jewish Passover Meal for people to witness and participate
- Twinning local places of worship
- Continue the planning of an Interfaith Sculpture

Additionally, £18,900 from the Faith Communities Capacity Building Fund has been awarded for: -

- Community Engagement this will support the costs of bringing people
 of different faiths together to plan for and host Borough wide 'Getting to
 know you events' (open days & interfaith dialogues at different places of
 worship) and neighbourhood level 'meet your neighbour' events, which
 will focus on particular areas where people who may be living 'parallel'
 lives.
- Youth Engagement this will support the costs of undertaking tours to places of worship; project work with young people, producing a DVD and hosting a conference.
